Sustainable Homes

Buying green electricity helps reduce your carbon footprint but in the longer term we also need to ensure our homes are energy efficient and include renewable technologies.

A perfect example to follow is Britain's first zero-carbon house which was created by converting a two-bed semi in Birmingham, originally built in 1840, into a groundbreaking



eco home which meets Level 6 (the highest level) of the UK Code for Sustainable Homes. The converted building is now also an Ofgem accredited power station generating for us at Green Energy UK.

The unique building is the vision of architect John Christophers of Birmingham-based Associated Architects. John, who will also be living in the home, says: "It's an eco-house that will produce at least as much energy as it consumes from the photovoltaic panels on the roof. It's designed to protect the environment and to show green does not have to be dull."

The Code for Sustainable Homes is an environmental assessment method for rating and certifying the performance of new homes with a view to encouraging continuous improvement in sustainable home building. Our specialist team at Green Energy UK are qualified assessors under the Code so if you are looking to obtain certification for a new property or development, get in touch and ask for a quote.

Welcome to new generator Western Solar

Green Energy UK is delighted to welcome Western Solar Ltd as a new generator. Western Solar Ltd has recently gained planning permission for a Solar Park on Rhosygilwen land. This makes it the first solar farm to be approved in Pembrokeshire and one of the first in Wales.

Dr Glen Peters, the owner, has always been very 'sustainability' minded – as is demonstrated by the vast array of renewable technologies already in use at Rhosygilwen.

The Solar Park – is a large photovoltaic scheme which will contain approximately 8000 PV panels across 12 acres and produce up to 2 mw of electricity per hour. That is twice as much as the local village uses in total per annum!

Dr Peters was very interested in working with Green Energy UK because of our record for sustainability and because our policies seemed to marry up very much with his own beliefs. He is delighted that Western Solar and Green Energy UK have been able to come together on this project. And so are we!!
